## Rabbi's Message



“The Prophets of Israel Demand Justice and Compassion”

The above line is the theme of this year's Summer Torah School. The prophets of ancient Israel were among the greatest thinkers and moralists of antiquity. Although they were a major theme of classical Reform Judaism, lately, I believe, they have not been given enough attention.

Many people think of prophets as predictors of the future – prognosticators. This is how they are taught in the fundamentalist Christian churches. I believe that the great prophets were far more than predictors of future events; they were the moral conscience of the Israelite nation, they were the ethicists of their day. They gave Israel a task and direction. Their teachings live on as a source of most beloved treasures of humanity.

The development of prophecy in ancient Israel had several stages: Early on there were bands of ecstatic prophets. They would sing, dance, play musical instruments and often induce themselves into a trance. There were also court prophets who advised kings whether to go to war or make concessions. There were “execrators” – prophets who specialized in cursing one's enemy (such as Balaam in the Book of Numbers).

Later on action prophets came on the scene. They included Samuel, Deborah, Nathan, Elijah and Elisha. They left no written speeches but they had the courage to confront kings when they committed sins. Both Nathan and Elijah confronted kings (David and Ahab respectively) for stealing (Bathsheba and Naboth's vineyard) by murdering their rightful owners (Uriah the Hittite)

and Naboth). In Israel, even the king was not above the law – an important principle of democracy.

The later literary prophets left us volumes of speeches. All of them complained about lapses into paganism. They also created moral values that are still highly meaningful in our day. Isaiah virtually invented the concept of peace – “Shalom” as a value that goes beyond a temporary truce. Amos was first to speak about the plight of the poor underclass. Jonah taught the value of repentance and God's universal care for all people.

The great literary prophets also gave comfort to the people of Israel. Jeremiah redeemed family land just before Nebuchadnezzar's destruction of Jerusalem. He firmly believed that Jews would return to plant and reap from that land. Ezekiel envisioned scattered bones coming together forming skeletons, taking on flesh and reviving as breathing human beings – a metaphor for the revitalization of the people of Israel – a phenomenon that has occurred twice in recorded history.

The children attending the Summer Torah School will learn about these great prophets and their teachings. On Friday noon, August 6<sup>th</sup>, there will be a “Biblical luncheon” – only foods eaten in Biblical Israel, and a series of skits and presentations about the great prophets and their messages. We cordially invite you to this occasion. Come eat as our ancestors did and revitalize your knowledge of some of the great prophetic teachings.
